

A STABLE HOME CHANGES MORE THAN AN ADDRESS

During the 2023–24 school year, 61,249 students in Los Angeles County experienced homelessness. Nationwide, that number exceeded 1.5 million public school students.

Behind every number is a child attempting to learn without knowing where the family will sleep, a parent working to hold the household together, and a future being shaped under the pressure of instability.

Housing instability does not remain confined to the home. It affects education, employment, physical and emotional well-being, family continuity, and the strength of entire communities. But when a family becomes stable, the impact moves in the other direction.

Children are better positioned to learn. Parents can work, plan, and rebuild. Families can establish roots. Neighborhoods become stronger. Generational outcomes begin to change.
